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Polymyositis And Dermatomyotosis

Polymyositis, which affects many different muscles, particularly the shoulders, hips and thigh muscles. It's more common in women and tends to affect people aged 30 to 60. Dermatomyositis, which affects several muscles and causes a rash. It's more common in women and can also affect children (juvenile dermatomyositis).

Polymyositis and dermatomyositis are connective tissue diseases characterised by inflammation of muscles. Idiopathic inflammatory myopathies are a group of chronic, autoimmune conditions affecting primarily the proximal muscles.

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Myositis (polymyositis and dermatomyositis) | nidirect

Polymyositis and dermatomyositis (PM/DM) are chronic inflammatory diseases of muscle. Muscle weakness is the most common symptom of PM/DM. The cause of PM/DM is unknown. Diagnosis of PM/DM involves physical examination of muscle strength, blood tests for muscle enzymes, electrical tests of muscle and nerves, and is confirmed by muscle biopsy.

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Polymyositis & Dermatomyositis Treatment, Diagnosis & Symptoms

Polymyositis and dermatomyositis are disorders of the body's connective tissues, which include tendons, ligaments and the dense sheets of collagen-based tissue that cover the ends of the muscles. These diseases cause swelling and tenderness in the muscles (polymyositis) and sometimes the skin (dermatomyositis).

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Polymyositis and Dermatomyositis - Cedars-Sinai

Dermatomyositis is a microangiopathy affecting skin and muscle; activation and deposition of complement causes lysis of endomysial capillaries and muscle ischaemia. In polymyositis and inclusion-body myositis, clonally expanded CD8-positive cytotoxic T cells invade muscle fibres that express MHC class I antigens, which leads to fibre necrosis via the perforin pathway.

Polymyositis and dermatomyositis are both characterized by chronic inflammation of skeletal muscle [ 21 ]. The inflammatory cellular infiltrates are typically composed of T cells and macrophages, although infiltrates with B cells have been observed in occasional patients, often with dermatomyositis.

Dermatomyositis is a form of systemic connective tissue disorder, a class of diseases that often involve autoimmune dysfunction. It has also been classified as an idiopathic inflammatory myopathyalong with polymyositis, necrotizing autoimmune myositis, cancer-associated myositis, and sporadic inclusion body myositis.

Polymyositis (pol-e-my-o-SY-tis) is an uncommon inflammatory disease that causes muscle weakness affecting both sides of your body. Having this condition can make it difficult to climb stairs, rise from a seated position, lift objects or reach overhead. Polymyositis most commonly affects adults in their 30s, 40s or 50s.
